
A ZOOM HOLY NIGHT

IN-CHURCH WORSHIP

I can't help but feel wonderfully blessed. We have been following the rules (masks, social distancing and hand washing) and have been able to enjoy in-church worship for at least a portion of our membership. Many of the same people have been worshipping each week, including newbies Kevin, Stuart, Connie and Joe, who are visitors and regular visitors attending most Sundays. We are thankful that they found their way to our doors.

In-church worship has, in some ways, helped our livestreaming by giving us more of a feel of real community. But remember, in-church worship is not everything.

Because of the rapid and current spread of Covid in PA and our concern for the health of our membership, Church Council voted to suspend in-church worship as of December 27. One member called for a congregational vote. An email was sent out to all members so that they could express their opinion and vote. In the end, we received 46 votes, 24 members plus 1 regular visitor in favor of stopping in-church worship temporarily and 20 members plus 1 regular visitor in favor of continuing it. The membership decision supports the vote of Church Council.

Pastor Wesemann will continue to lead worship from the church but with less than ten people in attendance. That number will include only those needed to lead and broadcast the service.

We will continue to worship together. Whether in-church, livestreaming or both, let's give thanks to the Lord for giving us these opportunities to worship together and enjoy church community.

ST. PETER'S 250th Year of Ministry

I wonder how many of our members really care about how long St. Peter's church has been in existence. Do we care? We are certainly not the oldest church around, but we are far from the youngest. What does it matter if we have a celebration? For those who do care, you might ask the question, "What can each of us do to help with the planning of our 250th anniversary?"

A milestone of 250 years of ministry is not reached by many churches. To put this in perspective, St. Peter's was a church before our country was a country. Our original church building was used as a hospital for George Washington's sick and injured troops, as was Zion's church building and Yellow Springs. This church has some fascinating history. At one time, it served as the site for a synod assembly. Our cemetery has become home for deceased soldiers of various wars, victims of a rather large train accident and even the cinematographer who made "The Blob".

I asked, "What can each of us do?" We have contacted the local historical society at Yellow Springs and plan to contact the Historical Society in West Chester for more information. We can help the committee with the planning of celebratory events. We plan to contact the Archives at the Lutheran Seminary. We can look through our old stuff and see if we have things connected to St. Peter's that could be put on display. We may be asked to purchase anniversary plates and maybe shirts. We may be asked to make an anniversary donation. We can simply volunteer to help.

Our anniversary task force is made up of Mary Eckerdt, Kristy and John Young, Betty Ryberg and Pastor. Ask them what you can do to contribute to the success of our celebration.

PAYCHECK PROTECTION PROGRAM LOAN

When the initial COVID restrictions began in March of 2020, we at St. Peter's began holding all worship services online. Council tracked our very reduced current giving totals. While some of the church expenses decreased as a result of not holding in-person worship, staff salaries, which is our largest expense, remained the same.

As the months went on, Council made the decision to apply for a loan from the Small Business Administration's Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) through Phoenixville Federal Bank and Trust. These loans were to cover payroll costs and covered utilities. On August 10, 2020, we were approved for the loan of \$20,407, with the option to apply for loan forgiveness.

Since our receipt of the funds, the government has declared that all PPP loans under \$50,000 will be forgiven and we will submit the forms for that forgiveness in February, 2021.

Next year, we will probably return to our usual Christmas Eve services, but I rejoice that we could worship in the way we did this year.




CHRISTMAS BLESSING
